## **Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time** 30 October, 2016

Year C: Wis 11:22-12:2; 2 Thess 1:11-2:2; Lk 19:1-10

Life gets messy, doesn't it? No matter how much we set things in place, or plan, or organise, life has a habit of turning us upside down. It may be something as simple as running out of milk, having to make a detour because of traffic works, or having an appointment cancelled. Or it could be something as big as our decision making and control being taken away from us, a health scare, or the loss of something or someone very dear to us. All of which have consequences.

In today's gospel, we hear of how Zaccheus' life was turned upside down. He had obviously heard of Jesus, and now wanted to see what he looked like. He was a senior tax collector and wealthy, so therefore probably not accepted or liked by the community in which he lived, nor maybe by those working under him. He was short, so needed to climb a tree to see, not expecting anything more than a glimpse. Unless he was particularly agile, or particularly liked climbing trees, this in itself may have been very humbling. And yet, he let go of dignity, embraced his inner child and climbed a tree to fulfil his desire, and have his life turned upside down.

His joy in being named and called by Jesus. That we should be so joyful in being named and called by God... Through our baptism, we are named and called by God.

During the week, the children and their families in the current sacramental preparation for Confirmation celebrated a Rite of Illumination. During this beautifully gentle ritual, we heard from the prophet Isaiah, of a people waiting in darkness. Of the Angel Gabriel and Mary's 'Yes', of Jesus, born in a stable. We lit the Paschal Candle. We heard how Jesus grew up, and gave hope to the people. And that Jesus was crucified and died for the hope he was giving to the world. The light snuffed out. We heard of Holy Saturday, the time of waiting, and then the discovery of the resurrection. The Light afire in the world. We heard of the apostles, receiving the light of faith, and sharing the light as they travelled, telling the Good News. We heard how we receive this light in our baptism, and how bright the light shines among all the baptised. God asks us to spread the light, not contain it or control it.

The parents were affirmed in giving their child the Light of Christ at baptism. And they were re-affirmed in continuing to spread the light of faith by lighting their child's baptismal candle from the Easter Candle, giving the candle to their child, saying the words "Receive the Light of Christ". The child received the light, saying "Amen", and placed the light on the table, for all the world to see.

Today, like Zaccheus, like our children preparing to celebrate the confirmation of their baptism and answer God's call, may we joyfully say "Yes! Amen!" to Jesus, and spread the light, out into the world.




