16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 20 July 2025

This Week's Readings: Gen 18:1-10; Col 1:24-28; Lk 10:38-42 Next Week's Readings: Gen 18:20-32; Col 2:12-14; Lk 11:1-13

As we enjoy the gentle beauty of life here on the Gold Coast—our breezes, beaches, and vibrant community—we're reminded this Sunday of another kind of beauty: the quiet beauty of being still with God.

The readings of Sunday call us to reflect on what it means to truly welcome the presence of Christ—not only in our homes and churches, but deep within our hearts. We are reminded that there is a kind of hospitality far greater than preparing meals or busying ourselves with service. It is the hospitality of attention, listening, and love.

In Genesis, Abraham welcomes three visitors under the oak trees of Mamre. He offers them food, shade, and rest. What seems like ordinary hospitality becomes something extraordinary: the Lord Himself is among them, and it is in

this moment of welcome that the promise of new life—Sarah's son—is spoken.

Fast forward to the Gospel: Martha, full of love and good intentions, busies herself serving Jesus. But Mary chooses something different. She sits at Jesus' feet, listening. Martha grows frustrated—understandably! But Jesus says something gently surprising: "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things. Only one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the better part."

Here, Jesus isn't condemning service. In fact, our parish and ministries thrive thanks to those who, like Martha, offer their time and talents. But Jesus is calling us to something deeper: to realise that activity without contemplation can become anxious toil. The heart of discipleship begins not with doing, but with being present to Him.

St. Paul, writing to the Colossians, gives us the key: "Christ in you, the hope of glory." God is not simply visiting from afar—He wants to make His home within us. That's a stunning reality. The same Christ who sat in Martha and Mary's home now sits at the centre of our lives, if only we make room for Him.

The Church teaches that through prayer, silence, and the sacraments, our hearts become dwelling places for the Lord. As St. Teresa of Avila said, "Settle yourself in solitude, and you will come upon Him in yourself."

This week, I invite you to:

- *Spend 10 minutes a day in silence, simply listening to God's voice.
- *Ask yourself: Am I choosing the better part?
- *Welcome Christ not only at Sunday Mass but in your weekday moments—in your home, your community, your conversations.

Whether we're serving others like Martha or sitting quietly like Mary, we are called to be people who make room for Christ—not only in the busyness of life, but in the stillness of the soul.

May we become, as Psalm 15 says, those who dwell in the Lord's tent—not only as guests, but as friends who sit and listen with hearts wide open. God bless you all,
