20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 17 AUGUST 2025

Year C/1

This Week's Readings: Jer 38:4-6, 8-10, Heb 12:1-4; Lk 12:49-53 Next Week's Readings: Is 66:18-21; Heb 12:5-7, 11-13, Lk 13:22-30

On this 20th Sunday in ordinary time, in the Gospel, Jesus speaks with burning urgency: "I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already!" (Lk 12:49). This fire is not the fire of destruction, but the fire of the Holy Spirit, the living flame of God's love that purifies, sanctifies, and gives light to the world. It is the same divine fire we received at Baptism, and which was sealed within us at Confirmation.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that this fire is the "transforming energy of the Holy



Spirit's actions" (CCC 696). It is the same fire that descended upon the apostles at Pentecost (Acts 2:3–4), turning ordinary fishermen into bold proclaimers of the Gospel. That same Spirit is at work in us, if we let Him, to replace fear with courage, sin with grace, and lukewarmness with zeal.

Jesus warns that his coming will bring division, even within families. This is not because He desires conflict, but because the truth of the Gospel demands a decision. We cannot serve both God and the world's passing values (Mt 6:24). Choosing Christ will sometimes mean standing apart, even from those we love, to remain faithful to Him. But as He assures us, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:10).

The saints show us what this looks like in practice. St. Catherine of Siena's timeless challenge still speaks to us: "If you are what you should be, you will set the world on fire." Holiness is not half-hearted; it is a total surrender to God's will. The saints allowed Christ's love to consume their pride, their fears, and their attachments, so that His light could shine through them. Their witness proves that the fire of Christ does not destroy, it refines, like gold tested in the furnace (1 Pet 1:7).

For our parish community, this call to be "hearts on fire" is very concrete. It means making the Eucharist the centre of our lives, drawing strength from the very Body and Blood of Christ, the "Sacrament of Love" as St. Thomas Aquinas called it. It means seeking the Sacrament of Reconciliation often, so that sin does not smother the flame of the Spirit within us. It means living the works of mercy daily, forgiving, visiting the sick, feeding the hungry, defending the vulnerable, for this is how the fire of charity spreads.

This week, let us ask: Where in my heart has the flame grown dim? Is it in my prayer life, my family relationships, my courage to live my faith openly, or my desire to serve the poor? If we give Christ even a small space, His Spirit will come in and set our hearts ablaze once more. And once that fire is lit, it will not remain hidden, it will draw others to the light of Christ present in His Church.

May our parish community be a living witness to the words of St. Paul: "Do not quench the Spirit" (1 Thess 5:19). Let us be a community where God's fire is not only kept alive but burns so brightly that all who come near are warmed by His love.

Dear brothers and sisters, peace be with you. My name is Lucia. I am married with my husband Carlo and we have eight children. We come from Italy, and we have been sent to Australia thirteen years ago as missionary family.

I come from a big family myself. The first sign of God's presence in my life has been through my parent's witness: despite their many differences they remained together and when I was 7yrs old we moved to Tokyo as a missionary family for the Catholic Church. It was a time full of precarities for the entire family. I suffered a lot of bullying at school, so I started to question God and the meaning of life. When I was twelve, we moved back to Italy and it was equally difficult as I had to adapt again to a different culture. As many teenagers nowadays, I had issues accepting myself and I stopped going to Church for a time. Even if externally, I looked fine, I was a very good student, playing sports, but on the inside I was feeling dead without meaning and I became bulimic. In that moment God came to rescue me. I was invited to listen some talks given in my parish. I began meeting regularly with a group of brothers and sisters to listen to the Word of God. Little by little I was helped to discover the Love of God. In the community I found a place where I could be myself, without being judged and where I could always hear a Word of Love for my life. God gave me the grace to reconcile with my parents and with my history. I was able to see that God was present in all the events of my life, even the difficult ones. Today I can see that God given me and my husband a life full of joy, beyond what we could imagine. I can see that in the struggles of raising children and economic stress, God is always present. This experience is possible also for you!

Young and old, COME AND LISTEN! God loves you. Let him speak to you! He is making all things new. We invite you to hear our experience of the Neocatechumenal Way which has been enriching the lives of many for the last 50 years and was described by St John Paul II as 'an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times'. May the Virgin Mary who inspired this Way intercede for us, that humility, simplicity and praise may appear among us. Let us all pray that this gift to the parish may bear fruit, fruit that will last!
