# ALL SOULS' DAY 2 November 2025

Year C/1

This Week's Readings: 2 Macc 12:43-46; Phil 3:20-21; Lk 7:11-17 Next Week's Readings: Ezek 47:1-2, 8-9, 12; 1 Cor 3:9-11, 16-17; Jn 2:13-22

As the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints and then the Commemoration of All Souls, we are reminded of the great mystery of the Communion of Saints, the unbroken bond between heaven and earth. On All Saints' Day, we rejoice with the countless men and women who now behold God's glory; on All Souls' Day, we lovingly remember those still journeying toward that vision. Together, these feasts proclaim that we are one family in Christ, pilgrims on earth, purified souls in hope, and saints in glory, all united in God's love.

On this Day, our hearts are drawn to remember with affection those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith. It is a day wrapped in quiet gratitude, tender sorrow, and deep hope. We remember



parents, friends, parishioners, and all who once walked beside us and now rest in the

Scripture reminds us, "The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them" (Wisdom 3:1). These words assure us that death does not destroy life, it transforms it. What is sown perishable is raised imperishable (1 Corinthians 15:42). In Christ, life is changed, not ended.

From the earliest centuries, the Church has prayed for the departed. The first Christians gathered in catacombs, celebrating the Eucharist among the tombs, proclaiming their faith that the dead live on in Christ. Our prayers, Masses, and acts of love are not mere memories—they are acts of communion. They express our belief in the Communion of Saints, that beautiful truth that the living, the departed, and those being purified are all united in Christ's Body, the Church.

St. Monica, on her deathbed, told her son St. Augustine, "Bury my body wherever you will; let not care of it trouble you. Only this I ask, that you **remember me at the altar of the Lord."** Her request became the heart of our tradition, to remember, to intercede, and to love beyond the grave.

St. John Chrysostom also encouraged the faithful: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why should we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation?"

Our prayers remind us that purgatory is not a punishment, but a place of hope, a final cleansing in love. The souls there are not forgotten; they are the beloved of God, waiting for the fullness of His light. When we pray for them, we offer them a gift greater than gold, the warmth of God's mercy flowing through our faith.

Jesus Himself comforts us with His promise:

"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, though he dies, yet shall he live" (John 11:25).

And again, "This is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day" (John 6:40).

Dear friends, this day is not about despair but about hopeful remembrance. Every candle we light, every name we whisper in prayer, every Mass we offer proclaims that love is stronger than death. "God will wipe away every tear from their eyes," assures Revelation 21:4, "and there shall be no more death, nor mourning, nor pain."

As a priest, I too carry in my heart the memory of many souls I have known, parishioners, mentors, family, and friends, who now rest in God's peace. When I lift the chalice at Mass, I feel their invisible presence. The altar becomes a meeting place between heaven and earth, where time and eternity touch.


Let us use this day to renew our faith in eternal life, to pray for those who still journey toward God's perfect love, and to live each day ready for that joyful reunion. As St. Augustine said so beautifully, "We are travellers on the same road; death is not the end, but the doorway to eternal life."

May our hearts be filled with hope, our prayers be filled with love, and our remembrance be filled with peace.

May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
