## THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA 9 November 2025

Year C/1

**This Week's Readings:** Ezek 47:1-2, 8-9, 12; 1 Cor 3:9-11, 16-17; Jn 2:13-22

Next Week's Readings: Mal 3:19-20; 2 Thess 3:7-12; Lk 21:5-19

This Sunday we celebrate a beautiful and often-overlooked feast, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, also known as the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Saviour and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist at the Lateran. Yet this feast reaches deep into the heart of who we are as Catholics, uniting us spiritually with the Church of Rome and reminding us that the Church is not just a building of stone, but a living temple of God's presence among His people.

The Lateran Basilica is the oldest and highest-ranking church in the world. Consecrated in the year 324 by Pope Sylvester I, it was the first church built after the Roman Emperor Constantine's conversion to Christianity. Before St. Peter's Basilica ever stood on the Vatican Hill, the Lateran Basilica was the seat of the Popes, their cathedral, their home, and the mother church of all Christian faithful. Its official title, "Omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput", "The Mother and Head of all the churches of the city and the world", expresses its universal importance.

But why does the Church invite us to celebrate the dedication of a specific building in Rome? Because this feast is not about architecture, it's about communion. The basilica stands as a visible symbol of the unity of all Catholics around the world with the successor of St. Peter, the Pope. It reminds us that every local parish, whether large or small, in bustling cities or quiet country towns, is connected to this mother church through the bond of faith, sacraments, and apostolic unity. When we honour the Lateran Basilica, we honour our own parish community as a living temple of God.

In the Gospel for this feast (John 2:13–22), Jesus enters the Temple and drives out those who had turned His Father's house into a marketplace. His words echo through the centuries: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." He was speaking not of the stone temple, but of His own Body, which would be raised from the dead. From that moment, Christ Himself became the new and everlasting Temple, the place where humanity meets God. And through baptism, we too become

His dwelling place. St. Paul reminds us, "You are God's temple, and God's Spirit dwells in you." (1 Cor 3:16).

This truth gives this feast its deep spiritual meaning: every church building, no matter how grand or humble, is holy because it shelters the living Body of Christ, His people. When we gather in our parish church to celebrate the Eucharist, we are not simply occupying a space; we are standing within the mystery of God's dwelling among us. The walls, the altar, the sanctuary lamp, all point to a greater reality: we are the living stones of the temple that God is building through faith, love, and service.

As we celebrate this feast, we might ask ourselves: What kind of temple am I? Do I keep my inner temple clean, open, and welcoming to God's Spirit, or have I allowed clutter, distraction, and sin to take over? The feast calls us to a spiritual renovation, a cleansing of the heart so that Christ may dwell more fully within us.

This celebration also invites us to renew our love for our parish church, which is our own "Lateran." It is here that we are baptized, forgiven, nourished, married, and blessed for eternal life. Every Mass, every sacrament, every prayer offered in our parish church joins in the unbroken praise that rises from all the churches of the world.

May this feast remind us that the true beauty of the Church is not in marble or gold, but in hearts united in faith and love. As the Lateran Basilica stands as a witness to centuries of faith, may our parish also stand as a living sign of God's presence in our community, a place of welcome, prayer, and healing for all.

Let us pray that, like the stones of that ancient basilica, we too may be bound together firmly in Christ, the cornerstone. May our lives shine with the beauty of holiness, so that others may see in us the living temple of the Holy Spirit.

Happy feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the mother and head of all churches and may our parish, too, reflect the glory of God dwelling among His people.



#### The Lateran Basilica

Today we celebrate the feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. The Lateran Basilica is the cathedral church of the Pope, who also holds the position of Bishop of Rome. It is considered the most important Catholic church because it contains the Cathedra Romana, the symbol of the teaching authority of the Bishop of Rome. The basilica was first dedicated in 324 after the property was donated to the Church by Emperor Constantine, the first Roman emperor to accept Christianity. Whilst we celebrate the dedication of this most important church, at the same time we celebrate all churches throughout the world.
