This Week's Readings: 1 Sam 3:3-10; 1 Cor 6:13-15, 17-20; Jn 1:35-42 Next Week's Readings: Jonah 3:1-5, 10, 1 Cor 7:29-31; Mk 1:14-20

One-day John the Baptist pointed to Jesus Christ and said, "Look, here is the Lamb of God." Two of John's disciples left him that day and immediately began to follow Jesus. When Jesus realized they were walking behind him, he turned and asked them, "What are you looking for?"



That is such a good question.

I can envision these two new disciples with their heads down, each nudging the other to answer Jesus' question. Finally, one of them says, "Teacher, where are you staying?"

To be honest, most of the questions I ask God really aren't very profound either. I would love to impress God with my speculations about the inner dynamics of the Trinity, but I'm not up all night thinking about that. The things that keep me up at night are much more trivial.

Most of us don't really yearn for world peace. We think world peace is a good idea, but what we are deeply concerned about and think about continually are issues like losing weight or getting our teenagers to talk to us, paying off the mortgage, worrying about elderly parents and so on.

The disciple's question, "Teacher, where are you staying?" was not a serious or deep question. But what's fascinating is that Jesus took the question seriously and invited the two men to follow him home. There they stayed with him, probably talking about a lot of ordinary things. Apparently the conversation was so ordinary that John didn't bother recording it in his Gospel. The important thing is not what they discussed but with whom they were talking. There are no dumb questions with Jesus. There aren't any smart ones either. Frankly, it doesn't matter what we are looking for in life. If we turn the search into a prayer, Jesus will use it to reveal more of himself to us. And once we come to see who he is, the other questions will become less important. That means about halfway through our prayers, if we are paying attention, it should not be uncommon for us to say, "Now, what was I asking? I really can't remember."
