THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

26 MAY 2024

Year B/2

This Week's Readings: Deut 4:32-34, 39-40, Rom 8:14-17; Mt 28:16-20

Next Week's Readings: Ex 24:3-8; Heb 9:11-15; Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three Persons.



Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in the name of the Trinity; this is one of the clearest attestations for Baptism in the name of the Holy Trinity found in Scripture. Other New Testament references to Baptism describe it as being celebrated in the name of Jesus. As we read this Gospel on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded that this central mystery of faith is meant to be lived. As baptized Christians, we share in the life of the blessed Trinity and seek to invite others to share in God's love.

The title of today's feast can be misleading to both congregation and preachers. This is not a day we celebrate a dogma of the Church. Dogmas are important, but we don't worship them as we gather for liturgical celebration. Nor is a day for a catechism lesson on how one God can have three faces and be called by three different names. I don't plan to take a shamrock into the pulpit this weekend to show how God could be one and three at the same time.

Someone said once, "Anyone who talks of the Trinity, talks of the cross of Jesus and does not speculate about a heavenly riddle." (Sorry, I don't know the source for this quote.) Christians know about God through our experience and key to that experience is something we have in common -- suffering and the cross.

How do we define the Trinity? After the great commission Jesus sends the disciples out to baptise - Jesus tells us -- "I am with you all days, until the end of the age." Jesus has "defined" God for us -- revealed God already with us.

Jingaree – Burleigh Parish in the *Year of Prayer* celebrates 150 years since the first Mass in their parish and their first church called All Saints.

In 1874 a Mass was celebrated under the tree at Berrigans Rd near Mudgeeraba by Fr Scrotechini. Fr Scrotechini was very good friends with Fr Julian Tennison Woods the co-founder of the Sisters of St Joseph with Saint Mary Mackillop. A church was later built in 1886 at Tallebudgera called All Saints. Bishop Vaughan, the second Bishop of Sydney, as part of his overland trip to visit Brisbane via the Cobb and Co track through Murwillumbah between 1878-1879 visited our little slab hut church at Tallebudgera.

Our *Year of Faith Pilgrimage* will meet with Mary Mother of God, St Patrick, Fr Scrotechini, Fr Julian Tennison Woods, Saint Mary of the Cross Mackillop, Sisters of St Joseph, Bishops, Servant of God Eileen O'Connor, Fr Dixon (first priest to celebrate Mass in Sydney Cove), Friar Pere Receveur (first European buried in the colony), and Pope Saint John Paul II relics Shrine. We end the pilgrimage on the Feast of All Saints.
