Life of a Christian in a Stormy World

Sea of Galilee: It is a lake thirteen miles long from north to south and eight miles broad from east to west at its widest. It is notorious for its sudden and severe storms. When a cold wind blows from the west, the valleys and gullies and hills act like gigantic funnels, compressing the winds and letting them rush down to the lake to create storms with violent



waves and that's exactly what happened as Jesus and His disciples were crossing the sea. The severity of the storm is evident while considering the reaction of his disciples who were experienced fishermen. Unable to control their fears in just such a storm, the disciples awaken Jesus, accusing him of disregarding their safety by saying "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" (v.38). Jesus' response is immediate. First, Jesus rebukes the winds and the sea, producing perfect calm, to the great astonishment of his disciples and then he reproaches them for their lack of Faith.

Scripture Lessons: The role of God in calming the storms of life both in the history of the Church and in the lives of Christians is the central theme of the readings for this Sunday.

The first reading (Job 38:1, 8-11) presents the picture how the Lord speaks to Job whose life was devastated by storms of the total loss of his possessions, the deaths of his dear ones, and a whole-body disease that left him in misery. "Out of the storm," God reminds Job that He is in control questioning his right to challenge God's authority and leading Job deeper and deeper into the mystery of creation.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 107:23-33) picks up the storm theme and tells us how the Lord saves the sailors caught up in the high waves of a tempest by first "raising up a storm wind," then "hushing the storm to a gentle breeze." "They who sailed the sea in ships ... saw the works of the Lord and His wonders in the abyss."

The second reading (2 Cor. 5:14-17) explains that Jesus died for us to make us a "new creation." In order to receive Jesus' gift of love, we have to respond with our loving self-surrender, living for Jesus in all situations of our lives especially the stormy experience of life.

The Gospel (Mark 4:35-41) describes how, by a commanding word, Jesus stilled a storm on the Sea of Galilee, returned the sea to its natural order, and saved the apostles from drowning. The incident reminds us to keep Jesus in our life's boat and to seek Jesus' help in the storms of life.

Church in a Stormy World: The image of the Barque of Peter allegorically presents the stormy lake as a symbol of the Church facing challenges and heresies from inside and various forms of suppression and persecution in the first three centuries from outside. The calm period followed the persecution was plagued with heresies, culminating in the Protestant Reformation Movement. In such situations the faithful wondered if Jesus had deserted the Church. Christianity should be the most persecuted religion in the world. Popes and preachers were martyred. Even today, so many priests and nuns are kidnapped and killed, so many churches are burned and the right of Christians to practice their faith in public as a community is denied. But in their desperate cry and prayers for help they are able to experience the inner peace and strength of Jesus in lives. In the modern world very often the Church and the faithful have no control over the political and social developments of our society. But no matter what we are experiencing, we can — with the help of Jesus — find peace. It is the peace which only Jesus can give. And it is a peace which no person, no thing, and no situation can take away from us.

Faith amidst Daily Storms: Everyone experiences some forms of storms in their lives when they feel the boat of their lives is being swamped. Many people have found great comfort in sensing Jesus' constant presence in the most stormy, difficult and dangerous crises. This is very symbolic. Our life on this earth can be like riding in a boat on an open sea. There are calm and beautiful days. But there are also dark and stormy nights when we really struggle with fear, doubts, conflicts, temptations and trials. On those moments of Christian life, if we focus on Christ who is with us, our life journey becomes easier and peaceful. Jesus never tells us that he shall provide us with a problem free life, but trust in him helps us to lead a peaceful life. Amen.

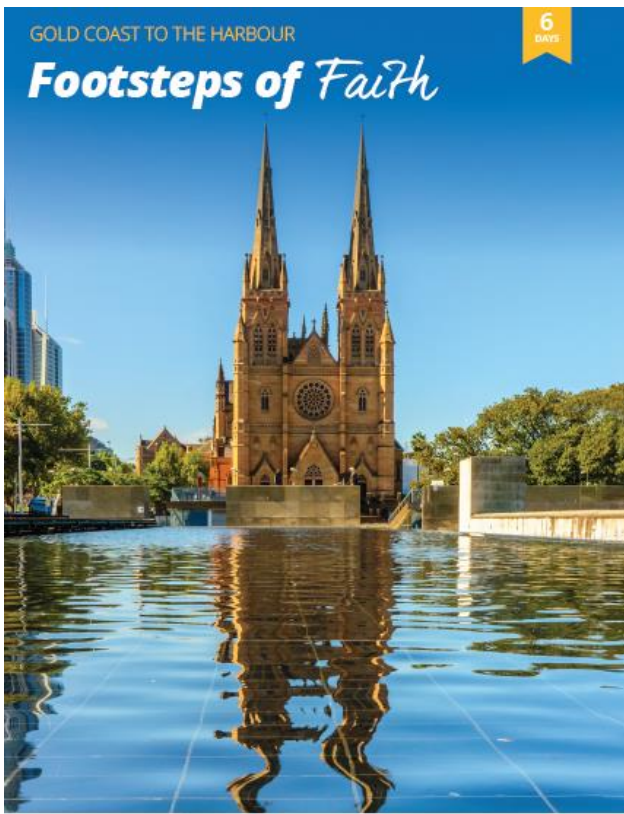

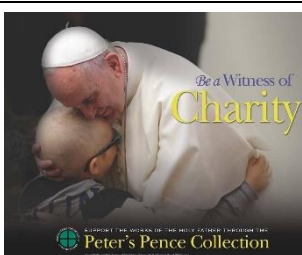
