



"FAITH THAT WAS REWARDED"





Today's Gospel contains what biblical scholars often call, "The Markan sandwich". One story is sandwiched between the beginning and end of another. This is an unusual combination of two miracle stories. The healing story of the woman with a chronic bleeding disease (Mk. 5: 25-34) is sandwiched within the story of the restoration of life of Jairus' daughter (Mk. 5: 21-24, 35-41). Jesus performed these miracles as rewards for the trusting faith of Jairus and the woman.

The stories have several common features. Jairus' daughter is 12 years old, and the woman had been suffering from haemorrhage for 12 years. Both the woman and the little girl are healed by faith i.e., the faith of the woman and the faith of Jairus. In accordance with Jewish prescriptions both the woman and the daughter of Jairus are unclean in their own conditions namely bleeding (Lev. 15:25) and death (Nm. 19:13). Still, touching becomes part of both healing miracles, where the woman touches the fringe of Jesus' cloak and Jesus touches the dead girl by taking her by hand. Thus, faith means touching God and being touched by the power of God.

Faith experience of Jairus: Jairus being one of the synagogue leaders was supposed to be well-respected man in the local Jewish community. He probably shared in the Pharisees' prejudice that Jesus was a heretic preacher to be avoided.

Further, the urgency of his need and the helplessness of the situation prompted him to humble himself to seek the help of Jesus. The raising of his daughter from death leads him to deep faith experience in Jesus.

Faith experience of the woman: The woman seems to have come to Jesus as a last resort, after trying every other cure known in her day. Probably, she decided to touch the tassels of Jesus' garment secretly in the context of the Mosaic Law that declared ritually unclean anyone with a chronic bleeding disease, and anybody who contacted the unclean person as well and it shut them off from the worship of God and the fellowship with others. (Lev 15:25-27). The question of Jesus, "Who touched my clothes?" is ironic as the crowd around him was pressing him from around. The touch of the woman was different from that of the crowd. While the crowd was touching Jesus physically the woman was touching him with faith and Jesus felt the difference in touching with faith. Her Faith in the healing power of Jesus was so strong that she risked breaking all the social rules to seek what she believed he could do for her. Jesus' affectionate call 'daughter' is an expression of the establishment of a personal relationship with Jesus as a member of Jesus' eschatological family and she was also fully restored to the normal religious and social life.


Conclusion: The primary condition for the effectiveness of our prayer is our Faith in the goodness and mercy of God. Further, it helps us to establish a personal relation with God. Without the faith of Jairus and the woman there would not have been miracles. It means wherever the faith of a human being and mercy of God converge miracles effect. Faith can, not only move mountains or storms of life (*last week's theme*), but it also moves the compassionate heart of God! Amen.
